I'll share Bro. Houk's words with you:

I'm the associate pastor of Living Hope, DC, a Metro Missions work in Washington, DC. For the last three years, I have been working with Pastor Jerry Staten to evangelize our capital. Until three years ago, there was no UPCI church inside the DC Beltway. 6 million people and no UPCI churches!

From that time, we have been working to evangelize the entire city. Within Washington, DC, there are 192 languages spoken, 174 countries officially represented with embassies, and 18 major universities. Needless to say, the field is ripe. On any given Sunday, Living Hope, DC ministers to 20-30 distinct cultures from about 15 countries. Many of those who attend LH are "townies", people who live here, but there are also a lot of transients. With schools, internships, temporary visas, military assignments, and diplomatic details being sent to DC, we have a great opportunity to extend our impact beyond DC. Whichever group someone falls into, we teach, train, and mentor them to enable them to be "missionaries" in their town, city, country, or culture.

Wow! Bro. Houk will be in Kentucky from February 7th to 18th. Your Sectional Director will be contacting you shortly to schedule services with him. Please open your hearts and your doors to Bro. Houk.
